

Public Notification of Nondiscrimination in Career and Technology Education Programs

Richard Milburn Academy integrates technology throughout its high school curriculum and offers approved career pathways, including career and technology education clusters, to meet graduation requirements in the State of Texas. Enrollment in these courses is based upon a student's completion of the appropriate prerequisite coursework and ability to meet criteria identified in the course description. Activities, programs, and privileges are made equally accessible to all students. Admission to RMA is based on the availability of student slots at the public charter high school. RMA educates students who have had difficulty in the traditional public school setting by offering small class sizes, flexible scheduling and certified teachers dedicated to meeting the individual needs of students. RMA does not charge tuition or fees.
